Department Highlights & Accomplishments:

During the 4th Quarter of 2021, the East Grand Rapids Department of Public Safety was able to:

- Successfully and safely hold the "7th Annual Public Safety Day" on Saturday, October 23. Despite Covid-19, the community showed up in significant numbers.
- Implement "Riding for Ryan" on "Public Safety Day." Riding for Ryan is a West Michigan non-profit
 organization founded in November 2019, whose mission and purpose is to promote the safety of
 young bike riders through visibility and awareness. The program's goal is to provide free bicycle flags to
 kids to help keep them safe as they bike around the city.
- Hire new PSO Tony Perez on October 18.
- Conduct annual firearms training at GRPD's outdoor range in October & November. All sworn personnel participated.
- Assist EGRPS with the "Homecoming Parade" on October 1.
- Assist Parks & Recreation with the "Biggby Coffee 5k Race" on October 10.
- Complete biannual medical first responder & CPR renewal certifications for sworn personnel in October & November.
- Conduct additional training on high-risk traffic stops, LGBTQ diversity awareness, HAZMAT refresher, bloodborne pathogens, "Right to Know" law, interview & interrogation techniques, and property & evidence management. Additionally, all personnel were required to review and sign numerous updated policies and procedures.
- On Friday, November 5 at 3:50 p.m., respond to a house fire in the 1700 block of Breton S.E. where flames were showing from the roof. Upon arrival, officers confirmed there was a working fire in the attic. On-scene personnel quickly extinguished the fire.
- On Friday, December 3 at 9:36 a.m., respond to the 2500 block of Hampshire Blvd. S.E. on a burning smell in the basement after the homeowner started her gas fireplace. Upon arrival, officers quickly discovered a fire in the chimney which was extinguished by on-scene personnel.
- On Wednesday, December 22 at 3:20 p.m., respond to smoke alarm going off with smoke in the basement that smells electrical. Upon arrival, officers confirmed there was a dryer fire which was already extinguished.

Traffic Stop Data Collection

DISCLAIMER:

The City of East Grand Rapids and the Department of Public Safety are committed to unbiased policing and the fair, impartial and equitable treatment of all people. Department policy strictly prohibits stopping or detaining any person based on race, ethnicity, traits, or lifestyles that may cause an inappropriate bias response or unjustifiable or unlawful discriminatory action.

The Department will report quarterly raw numbers for: (1) vehicle stop categories; and (2) crash incidents without <u>analysis</u>. The reader is cautioned to not draw any definitive conclusions at this point. There are many factors that must be considered to develop a comprehensive understanding of what is occurring when it comes to vehicle stop activity. Research has clearly shown that associated datasets such as geographic location, reason for stop, whether a search occurred, and the result of the traffic stop need to be factored into the analysis.

When it is determined that enough data is collected by several independent research firms/experts, the Department will develop an RFP for an independent research firm/expert to review and conduct advanced examination and analysis of our traffic stop data, including all relevant data sets. Once the study is complete, it will be shared publicly.
